District 13 Corrections Service Info Sheet

Requirements:

Please have 6 months of consecutive sobriety.

If you have served time in either jail, they ask that you not volunteer in that particular jail.

WARREN COUNTY

The meeting for both male and female inmates would be held at the same time on Mondays 6:30 to 7:30 pm.

Warren County has (4) pods, therefore will require (8) volunteers every week.

Fill out the application and return to the corrections chair. Once your application is approved you will receive an OCR # and a link to go online to make an appointment for fingerprinting. The cost for this is \$12.00.

WASHINGTON COUNTY

The meetings will be held on Mondays 6:30-7:30 Women / 7:30-8:30 Men

Fill out the application and return to the corrections chair. There is no fingerprinting required in this county.

- Each meeting will require (2) AA volunteers in attendance.
- Warren County has a volunteer acknowledgement form that a Correction member will go over with each representative to make them aware of what is allowed in the Facility.
- Once there are enough volunteers for each county, the Corrections Chair will make a schedule for each month.

IF YOU KNEW...

BRIDGING THE GAP (BTG)

A simple question for each AA member:

If you knew that someone from your hometown had been in a treatment or rehab facility and, while there: came to recognize his or her problem with alcohol abuse; had learned about AA's program of recovery; and, was coming home soon - but didn't know anyone in AA in his or her hometown or where local AA meetings were - and wanted to meet local AA members and attend local AA meetings...

Would you be willing to meet that individual, take him or her to a few local AA meetings and introduce him or her to other local sober AA members? Would you?

Most of us would say "Yes, of course, I'd gladly do that!"

Ah, but the key question is: How would you know that person 'is coming home?'

The answer: AA's Bridging the Gap [BTG] program. Simply put, if you tell us you are willing to help and give us <u>iust your first name and phone number</u>, <u>it will work!</u> How?

When someone is 'coming home,' we will contact you and say 'Jim or Sarah is coming home on [date]; could you meet that person or take him or her to the first few local AA meetings and introduce him or her to other local sober AA members?

This may happen only once or twice a year. If it's good timing for you, we'll give you all the details. If it's not good timing for you, just say so and we'll go on to the next person on the list. You do not become that person's AA sponsor; you just become an initial welcoming AA member who cares!

Please consider this really great and simple opportunity to be of service to the AA newcomer.

Why not let our District 13 BTG Chair Bill know at the next District 13 meeting.

It is vitally important to the continued existence of our fellowship that we, as members, understand and take the actions depicted in "The Man in the Bed". Our fellow members need to be reminded that this action is how the Founders stayed sober and how AA grew in membership.

The simple fact that as members of AA, we no longer regularly take these actions is directly causal to why we are not continuing to grow in membership and why folks are dying from this disease.
